

Gangplank: The ramp or walkway used to board and disembark the ship

- Helm: The steering wheel or control system used to navigate the ship

Itinerary: The planned route and schedule of the cruise

 Junior suite: A cabin that is larger than a standard cabin and often includes additional amenities

• Knot: A nautical unit of speed, equivalent to one nautical mile per hour

 Lounge: A public area where passengers can relax, socialize, or enjoy entertainment

 Muster station: A designated location where passengers must gather in the event of an emergency

 Nautical mile: A unit of distance used in navigation, equivalent to approximately 1.85 kilometers

 Onboard credit: A credit or voucher that passengers can use to Free Download items or services on board

- Passenger deck: A deck where passenger cabins and public areas are located
- Pool deck: A deck where passengers can enjoy swimming, sunbathing, and other poolside activities
- Port: A side or side of the ship, also used to refer to a destination where the ship docks

 Quartermaster: A crew member responsible for navigating the ship using charts and instruments

- Reception: The main information and guest service desk on board
- Registry: The country where the ship is registered and flies its flag

- Shore excursion: See excursion
- Spa: An area on board offering massage, beauty treatments, and other wellness services
- Stateroom: Another term for cabin

- Tender: A smaller boat used to transport passengers between the ship and the shore
- Tonnage: A measure of the weight or volume of a ship

 Ultra all-inclusive: A type of cruise package that includes all meals, drinks, and most activities without additional charges

• Veranda: An outdoor space or balcony attached to a cabin

• Wake: The waves created by the ship as it moves through the water

X-ray: A medical imaging technique used in the ship's medical center


