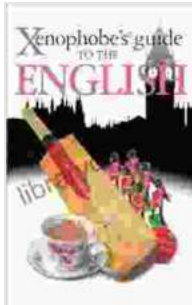

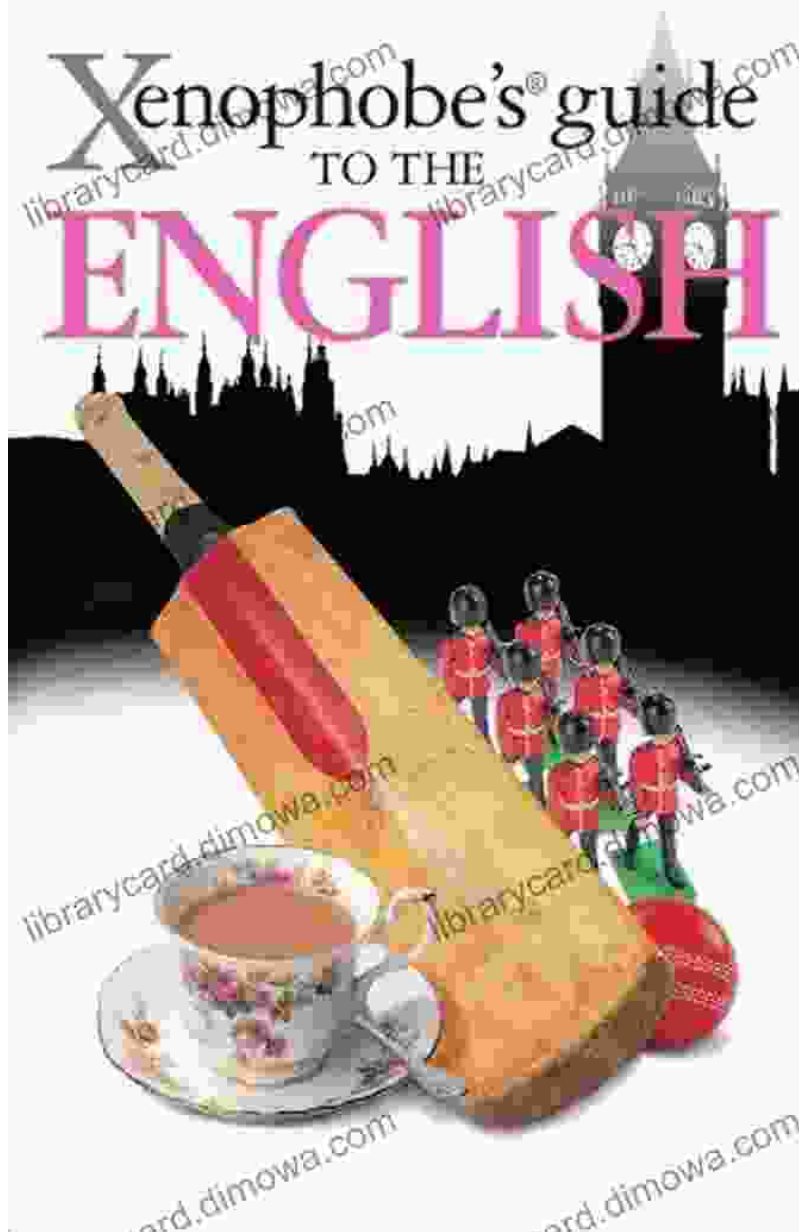

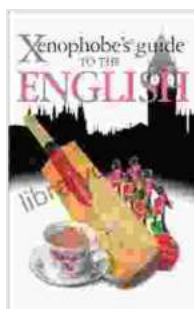
About the Author
