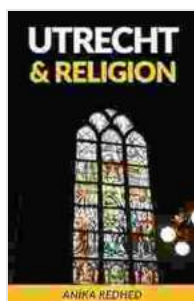

The DPC is divided into 13 regions, each of which is led by a regional council. The regional councils are responsible for overseeing the work of the congregations in their region.

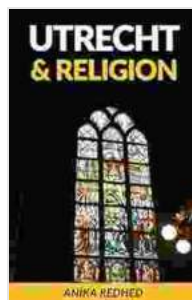
Mission and Outreach

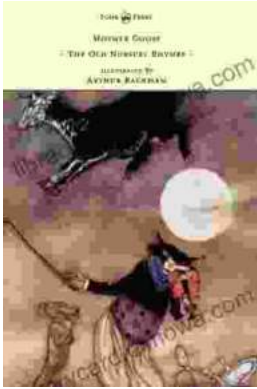
